DESTIN ACHIEVEMENTS

- audit of the curriculum of 20 degrees, with gap analysis and action plans at 10 Ukraine HEIs;
- trained curriculum teams in the alignment of programmes and QA with EQF standards;
- field trips to two EU universities to explore European models of Journalism education to inform curriculum reform;
- trained academic and professional staff in principles and processes of QA peer review:
- conducted QA peer reviews (desk based) of all new/revised programmes;
- delivered and evaluated the first two years of all new/revised BA and MA programmes;
- produced National Guideline Statements for BA and MA Journalism education;
- produced a toolkit to address programme design and teaching and learning;
- formation of Ukrainian Forum for Educations in Media and Journalism;
- delivered and evaluated Outreach Media Literacy Courses for target groups;
- developed and delivered a dual degree MA between a EU and a Ukraine partner.

OUTCOMES

DESTIN was a curriculum development project that enhanced the environment in which journalism graduates work within Ukraine, improved the 'media literacy' of key target groups, raised public understanding of journalism and the vital role that journalists and media play in the promotion and protection of citizens rights within a multicultural democracy. The partners also ensured that Ukraine QA agency guidelines were built into the project outcomes.
